LEE FOWLER SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARDS

The Lee Fowler Scholar-Athlete Awards Program was established at Louisburg College in 2005 both in honor of Lee Fowler and to encourage student-athletes at Louisburg to be scholar-athletes.

For 2009, ten Fowler Scholar-Athletes earned 4.0 averages; thirty-four Fowler Scholar-Athletes were on the dean's list, and sixty-five Fowler Scholar-Athletes were on the honors' list.

LEE FOWLER

A native of Columbia, Tennessee, Lee Fowler boasts over three decades of experience in collegiate athletics as a player, coach and administrator. As a student athlete, Lee was a starter and top reserve on the Vanderbilt Commodores' 1974 Southeastern Conference Championship team. Known and respected by virtually every member of the Vanderbilt University community, Lee established a campus-wide reputation for his charisma, his integrity and his civility. Those qualities, combined with his persistence, his faith, his insistence that that all human beings, regardless of resources or position, be treated with dignity and respect, and the rigorous education he received at Vanderbilt, provided the foundation for personal and professional success.

Since 2000, Mr. Fowler has served as director of athletics at North Carolina State University. Since his arrival at NC State, the level of talent, expectations and success has increased in every area of Wolfpack athletics, including academics. In fact, under Fowler's leadership, NC State has invested heavily in the academic support of student athletes, and NC State has ranked among the ACC leaders with regard to the number of post-graduate scholarships awarded.

Before his appointment at NC State, Lee served as director of athletics at Middle Tennessee State University (1994-2000), as associate athletic director and Director of the Tiger Clubs at Memphis (1986-94), as assistant coach for the Memphis men's basketball team (1979-86), and as assistant coach at Vanderbilt University (1975-79). During Fowler's tenure at Memphis, the men's basketball team routinely ranked among the nation's Top Ten, and the 1986 squad advanced to the Final Four.

Recognized nationally among his peers in the NCAA, Lee served on the prestigious NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee from 1997-2002 and was elected chair and spokesperson for the Committee in 2002. Among other responsibilities, the Committee administers the NCAA basketball tournament. While serving on this Committee, Lee was named Time.com's Person of the Week in March of 2002. Lee also served as chair of the subcommittee for television and as acting chair of the NCAA Basketball Issues Committee.

Fowler earned the degree *bachelor of arts* from Vanderbilt University in 1974 and the degree *master of science* from the University of Memphis in 1986. Lee Fowler and his wife, Carol, have three daughters: Ashley, Kristin Leigh and Carlee.
