

REGINA MILLER



*Considering the number of standouts who have suited up for the storied Louisburg College women's basketball program through the years, it takes a special player to be mentioned among the school's all-time greats.*

*And nobody will dispute Regina Miller's lofty place in the LC history books. A two-time, First Team All-American at Louisburg, Miller helped the Lady Hurricanes claim the 1981 National Junior College Athletic Association under fellow Hall of Fame inductee Paul Sanderford.*

*Upon her graduation from LC, Miller joined the powerhouse Old Dominion program for two seasons, and the Lady Monarchs would reach the NCAA Final Four in both of those campaigns. Following a professional stint with the Virginia Waves, Miller got into coaching, beginning with two seasons as part of Sanderford's staff at Western Kentucky University. The Lady Toppers would reach the Final*

*Four in both of those campaigns.*

*After working at Arizona in 1986-87, Miller returned to Old Dominion and spent four successful years, with the Lady Monarchs qualifying for the NCAA Tournament each season.*

*Miller then accepted the head coaching position at Western Illinois, where she would spend six campaigns. She guided WIU to its first-ever winning year in 1993-94 and its initial NCAA Tournament appearance in 1994-95.*

*In 1998, Miller became the head coach at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas (UNLV). In 10 years, the Lady Rebels would boast a 175-125 record, including six straight postseason appearances from 2001-06.*

*In addition to her on-court success, Miller has been actively involved in community events at each of her coaching stops.*
