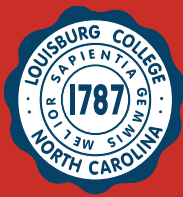

Academic Colloquium Speaker Series: Dr. Eric Motley

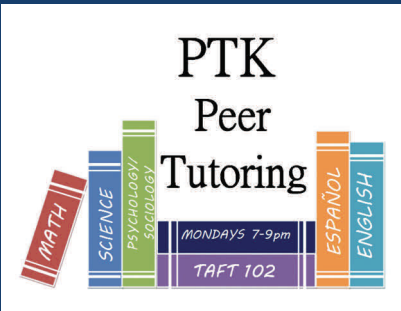
Thursday 9/27, 6:30pm, Frances Boyette Dickson Auditorium

Athletics Review

Men's Golf — Three tournaments into the season, the golf team has earned two 2nd-place finishes (311 and 307), taking 3rd place at their most recent tournament with a team score of 316.

Women's Soccer — The Lady 'Canes evened up their season record at 2-2 with a 3-1 win over the Wake Tech Community College last week, and handed USC Salkehatchie their first loss of the 2012 season, 6-1.

Men's Soccer — The #20 Louisburg College men's soccer team improved their season-opening win streak to five as they knocked off USC Salkehatchie, 3-1, this past Saturday afternoon.

Women's Volleyball — The volleyball team dominated Johnston Community College last week as the Hurricanes swept the Jaguars 3-0, though yesterday they dropped a road conference match to Cape Fear Community College.

Football — Hurricanes football improved their 2012 record to 3-0 as they knocked off Gray Military Academy, 34-32, Sunday afternoon. The previously undefeated War Eagles couldn't overcome a great first half effort from LC.

LC Relay Team Named “Rookie of the Year”

This past spring, administrative assistant for Academic Life and Crossroads instructor Leigh Anne Parrish captained Louisburg College's first-ever **Relay for Life** team, with help from Adam Wade, Wendi Eck, and an amazing group of volunteers and fundraisers.

It was an incredible semester, and Team Louisburg College was able to raise \$2,613.00 in the fight against cancer. This fundraising effort earned us a Bronze Level Club membership, and the honor of being named "Rookie Team of the Year" for Relay for Life of Franklin County.
