

SUMMER SCHOOL 2009

Louisburg College will offer a wide array of courses this summer, beginning June 30 and running through July 24.

Darrin Snyder Belousek will teach an Introductory Philosophy course (PHI 112) in which he will incorporate a study of the novel *Sophie's World* by Swedish writer Jostein Gaarder. This course will explore the perennial questions of human existence: Who are we? Where does the world come from? What is our purpose? What is the best life? What is real? And how do we know what's real? "We will explore these questions through the eyes of Sophie, a young woman whose world is shaken up by a philosophy professor, which turns a literary mystery into a philosophical mystery," explains Belousek. "Even an adult who has always wanted to learn more about philosophy but thought that the class would be dry and boring would thoroughly enjoy this approach and Dr. Belousek's engaging teaching style," says Humanities Chair Laura Kinzinger.

Professor Josh Parrott will teach a course on the New Testament (REL 102) this summer. Parrott will focus on the life and teachings of Jesus and his role as the most influential figure in human history, as well as the life and letters of Paul. Parrot plans to incorporate pictures he took during a recent trip to Israel and Jordan during discussions about historic sites.

An Old Testament course (REL 101) will also be taught as an independent study by Professor Charles Sloan.

For those interested in pottery, Art Professor Will Hinton will teach a ceramics/pottery class (ART 136) this summer in which students of all skill levels are welcome. "The course will begin with creating functional cups and bowls," says Hinton, "and move forward with slip-decorated plates and serving trays."

Dr. Helen Othow will teach Expository Writing (ENG 111), the initial course in a series of first-year college writing courses which are transferable to other North Carolina community colleges and state universities. Enrollment is by placement testing, which will be given the day before summer session classes start.
